CASEMENT PARK

Casement Park will provide Ulster GAA with its provincial stadium in Ireland's second city. The new stadium will be the catalyst for the further development of Gaelic games in Belfast and throughout Ulster, inspiring a new generation and bringing colour and capacity sporting attendances.

Sport will be the core purpose of the stadium serving our national games – football, hurling, camogie, handball and rounders – and it will become a venue for some of the largest, most significant, and most exciting GAA games that will be played on the island.

As an inclusive seven-day-a-week facility, Casement Park will put the community at its heart delivering long-lasting community benefits, socially, culturally and economically. As well as providing jobs to local people there are plans for a community café, an education and heritage centre, event space and conference facilities within the new stadium.

The stadium is being designed by global award-winning architects Populous and when completed will have a capacity of more than 30,000. Using cutting-edge 3D visualisation, the design team has been able to ensure that the best possible sightlines are achieved from every seat in the stadium, providing an enhanced viewing experience for patrons.

The revenues created by Casement Park on match days and throughout the year will be reinvested back into the GAA community by the Association. As with the generations who grew up playing Gaelic games at the old Casement Park, the new stadium will help nurture the development of GAA players from across the province.
